The Roll of Officers was called.

Minutes from the previous meeting, November 9th, 2000, were approved.

Officer's Reports

Grand Knight's Report: Jeff Block

1. A shirt was provided as a gift from the council to Jim Decker for his endless efforts on the council's behalf!
2. The February meeting (February 8th) will be our annual Lite Night with the Knights. The business meeting is replaced by a wine and cheese social in the commons. Spouses or girlfriends (please don't bring both) are welcome and encouraged.

Youth Director: DeWayne Gallenberg

1. A reminder was provided that the Annual Free Throw Contest will be held in January for boys and girls, ages 10-14 (as of January 1st 2001). This event is free with trophies awarded to the gender/age group winners. The winners also advance to a district contest. The free throw contest will be held on a Sunday in January. Old Business

1. **Stage set up:** the stage recently constructed will get its debut at the Holy Spirit School Christmas program. Set up and take down schedules were discussed.
2. **Holy Spirit Church Christmas Ornaments:** Ornaments will be sold in narthex after masses December 17th.
3. **Pancake breakfast past:** Boy Scout Troop 110 had a successful breakfast Sunday November 19th. The Troop raised \$500. With matching funds provided on a one-time basis, the Boy Scouts will be presented with \$1000.
4. **Pancake breakfast future:** February 18th breakfast will tentatively benefit the Holy Spirit 8th graders planning a class trip to Washington DC.

New Business

1. **Pancake breakfast fundraising criteria:** Given increasing numbers of requests by groups to use our council's pancake breakfast as a fundraiser, a discussion has begun regarding criteria by which requests could be evaluated.
2. **"Passion According to Luke":** Resurrection parish is hosting a troop who will present a play by this title. Similar to our previous support of the play "Therese" in 2000, Council #11460 will provide start-up funds for this effort.
3. **Marathon for Nonpublic Education:** Jeff Block and Larry Burgart have met with members of the Lourdes public relations committee at their request. They are interested in learning from our council's successful fundraising and community building events. Their concern is that the marathon held in the fall has become stagnant. They are looking for any and all input to improve this event. The beginning framework is that the event(s) be held on the first weekend in October (national weekend for nonpublic education) and will have the following components: community involvement (service), spirit builder and fundraiser. Please forward any ideas or interest in involvement to Jeff Block or Larry Burgart.

The meeting adjourned at 8:50 p.m.

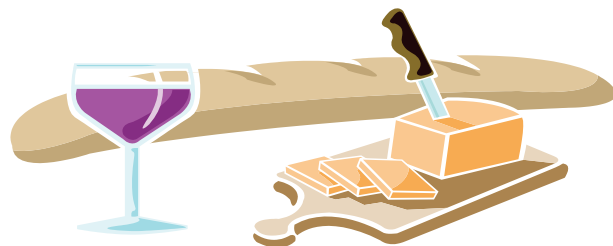
