CHARITY was the lesson learned in your First Degree, and it was no doubt a memorable experience. Come and renew your commitment to your Catholic faith, your community, and your family.

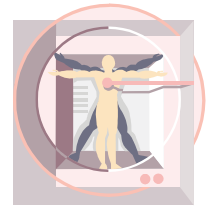

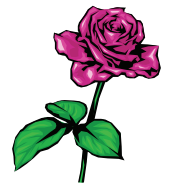

The Lord's Prayer, Hail Mary, and the Pledge of Allegiance were recited.

The Roll of Officers was called. The Deputy Grand Knight, Chancellor, Recorder, Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Warden, two Guards, and one Trustee were present.

Minutes from the previous meeting, December 20th, were approved.

A Form 100 was read.

Officer's Reports

3. **Storage Space - Brad Brech**

This continues to be worked out with the school and the church. We are able to use the doors from the church that came down from the recent construction. If you would be interested in working on this project, please volunteer and talk with Brad.

4. **Humanities Fair - Brad Brech**

The Holy Spirit faculty has agreed and the date is set for May 9-10. Parents will be invited to attend on Thursday night. We will not be giving awards this year at the discretion of the teachers. It will be a Humanities Fair with different grades doing different projects.

New Business

1. **Lite Night**

It was suggested to move the Lite Night for February to the 12th. Cards will be sent out to let members know of the new date. This way we will also hold the Lite Night before Lent Begins on February 13.

2. **Lenton Fish Fry – Council #1013**

A request has been made to help with one or more of Council # 1013's Lenten Fish Fry's at their Council Hall. These happen on the Fridays during Lent with the exception of Good Friday. Help is needed to serve and assist. If you are interested in helping please contact Ken Mueller or Mike Madden.

3. **Peace Prayer Evening – Jim Buntrock**

Our Council will be sponsoring the Evening Prayer on Tuesday, January 15. Jim will lead the Rosary as part of the prayers. Please attend if you can make it. Neil Stiller reported that some volunteers have offered to sing and play at a prayer night as well.

District Deputies Report

1. Ken read a letter from the Supreme Council congratulating our area for the new Council. Council #13027 was recently started at Resurrection Parish.
2. Ken is looking for volunteers to help at the District Free Throw Contest February 10 at Lourdes High School from Noon to 2 p.m. Ken will also need help on February 17 for the Regional Free Throw Contest at Lourdes from Noon to 2 p.m. The state contest will be in St. Cloud on March 10.
3. There will be a Major Degree at Lourdes on March 3. We really need to have a full house at that degree!
4. A topic at the Mid-Winter KC meeting was membership retention. We need to find out what our member's interests are and do more to get them involved. Why aren't Knights participating, and how do we get Knights to a Major Degree? You are not a Knight until you have completed the 3rd Degree. It was mentioned that we send an interest survey out with our dues each year, to try and find out who would like to help with, or create new Council events.
5. A new 1st Degree program coming out is called The Shining Armor.
6. Father McGivney Guild: There are 44,000 Knights in the state of MN, and only 1168 have signed up for the Guild. Ken challenged our council to 100% participation.

8. Council #13027 put together a PowerPoint presentation for their use in recruiting and membership growth.
9. There is a push to create more 2nd and 3rd Degree teams in the state.
