Then consider helping out at one of the Christmas Anonymous activities below. All of these activities are very worthwhile and rewarding. I've been involved with Christmas Anonymous for 14 years now and look forward to it each year! - Dec 6, 5:30-7pm – UNLOAD TOY DRIVE TRUCK – We need 3-4 guys to help unload the truck of toys collected by the KTTTC Toy Drive.
- Dec 7, 1-4pm – BASKET LOADING – Help load food/gift boxes (baskets) into cars for delivery to seniors. This happens on Sunday in the afternoon at the Assisi Heights back parking lot. There are two shifts available, 1-2:30pm and 2:30-4pm.
- Dec 7-8 – BASKET DELIVERY -- Help deliver food/gift boxes (baskets) to seniors. Folks often ask me what activity they can do with their children, this activity is great for kids accompanied by father Knights! You start at Assisi Heights and sign up to deliver to 4-10 seniors, then load baskets in back parking lot and deliver throughout the city. Sunday from 1-4pm, Monday from 4-6pm
- Dec 8, 8am-Noon – MOVING TABLES & FOOD -- We need help transporting tables and food to Christ United Methodist Church. Most of the crew is made up of retired guys and any new blood is welcome!
- Dec 11-12, 8am-5pm – TOY STORE SET UP – Help unpack toys and set up our New and Used toy stores and other departments in need. No crowds and no pressure, just setting up toy displays/tables for the store.
- Dec 13 – TOY STORE ESCORTS – Help shop with parents of families during our "TOY STORE". Plenty of help is needed for this activity (Over age 16 only please). As usual, we've split this into overlapping shifts:

Old Business

- Larry Burgart presented a summary of the Spirit Run for this year. 160 people ran in the 10K and 5K races, with many kids participating in the 1K. A summary was given in the November newsletter. Many families participated. Folks always compliment on the great hospitality given by Holy Spirit. Thanks to the Rochester Track Club for equipment and setup; all the cookie bakers; Duane Price and Bill Oertli for their consistent sponsorship; the HS Boy Scout Troop; and Superior Screeners for the excellent work on the t-shirts. Next year the committee will be re-formed and will be on the job a bit earlier.
- Pancake Breakfast will be held December 7th. We are adding scrambled eggs to the menu and will adjust the prices slightly. We will be offering Christmas ornaments for sale at the breakfast.
- Help is needed for the yearly membership drive after Masses in the narthex on December 7th in coordination with the pancake breakfast. Men who aren't members of Holy Spirit can join, but we should not actively recruit outside of the parish or school.

- We continued the discussion on offering a "Chili and Booyah" sale for the Super Bowl. It was decided we could do this and moved the discussion of how to the December meeting.

New Business

- Brad Brech reported that Council 1013 is hosting the 2005 State Convention here in Rochester. Brad has offered our council's help with volunteers and by taking them through what we did and what we learned from our experience.
- Brad reported that Cathy Nelson has requested the Knights to make breakfast for the Youth Choir at their appreciation event at the end of the year.
- Brad reported that Council 1013 will be moving their Friday Fish Fry from a monthly to a weekly schedule sometime soon. 12 people are needed to staff a meal and they've requested us to help. This would be a once a month commitment for our council, but potentially a very good fund-raiser. It was felt that we could not commit at this time, but we will investigate what we can do to form teams that could rotate through a schedule. Dave Hubka suggested that the parish may want to use this opportunity to help pay off the parish debt.
- Brad queried the interest in supporting an essay contest for Catholic School Week. We currently sponsor a contest for our 8th graders, but this would be bit different since it would involve more grades and done with the teaching staff. Topics are TBD, but would include School/Church and perhaps specific to HS School. Savings Bonds would be the awards. We will check to see if there is any teacher interest in this.

- Frank reported that the Men's Choir will be singing on December 21st at the 9:30 Mass.
