

I have participated in several of the Envision input sessions, and was at the Listening Day on January 8, 2005. There's no magic here, but it is a good chance to sit back and reflect on where the parish is today, where it started, and where we want it to go. One very broad statement is that we started as a small group, where everyone knew each other, and everyone needed to pitch in to make things happen. We have grown immensely since then, and now we are a reasonably large group, we don't all know each other, and there are some folks who do a lot of work, others who want to help but don't know how to get connected, others who don't feel welcomed to join in, and yet others who don't want to be very active.

I am struck by the fact that while this is certainly true for our parish, it is also very true for our KC council.

And when we have gone over the problems the parish has had adjusting to being larger, and especially to the problems

of making new members feeling welcomed and getting them connected and involved, I see parallel concerns with our council.

At this point, I would first of all invite each and every one of you to get involved in the Envision process the parish is going through. Watch for news in the parish bulletin - I know there is another key event scheduled for Saturday, February 26, 2005.

And, while the Envision process is intended for the parish, be alert for parallel concerns with our KC council, and help us learn and address these as well.
