Opening

Grand Knight Dave Hubka called the meeting to order at 7:55 PM in the Library of Holy Spirit Parish. Dave led the group in the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance. The Role of Officer's was called. Grand Knight Dave Hubka; Deputy Grand Knight Greg Kapraun; Chancellor Paul Daley; Recorder Jerome N. Lensing; Financial Secretary Jim Decker; Lecturer Dave Rossman, and Warden DeWayne Gallenberg were present. The minutes of the June, 2006 meeting were approved. No Form 100s were read.

Officers Reports
