Proposal for Raising Our Dues

The motion carried at our September and October meetings to raise our annual council dues from \$25 to \$30 starting in 2008. As I've mentioned the past several months, our dues haven't changed in the nearly 13 years since we've started our council, and in the meantime various expenses have been regularly going up. Raising dues is a change to our bylaws, which requires approval at 3 separate council meetings to be effective, so I'll bring it up again at the November meeting for final approval.

Assuming it is finally approved, I will also make the following motion for a special one time offer. If you have any thoughts on any of this, feel free to contact me at dhubka@magnaspeed.net or 282-6090.

Offer a special one-time option for 1Q08: When paying 2008 dues, members may either pay \$30 for their 2008 dues, or pay \$100 for 4 years dues (2008-2011) at the old rate of \$25. Special notes:

- The special offer does not apply to members paying the student dues of \$10 in 2008.
- The special offer is valid only for payments postmarked by March 31, 2008.
- The special offer is also available for transfers-in and new members in 1Q08.
- If a member takes advantage of the special offer and then drops his membership (or dies) before the end of 2011, there shall be no refund.
- If a member takes advantage of the special offer and then transfers out of our council before the end of 2010, then they will still owe dues to their new council the years after their transfer is effective.

Words from the Lecturer

Pine Ridge

Rick Stevens, Janela Hubka, and Irissa Hubka were our guests at the regular October council meeting. The topic of their presentation was the youth mission trip to the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation.

The Pine Ridge reservation is home to the Oglala Sioux Tribe, and it is situated in southwestern South Dakota on the Nebraska state line, about 50 miles east of the Wyoming border. The area includes over 11,000 square miles contained in seven counties.

The population of the Reservation is around 30,000. Shannon is the poorest county in the nation, with an average annual family income of \$3,700 and unemployment nearing 80%. Life expectancy is 48 for men and 52 for women, and almost half the people over age 40 have diabetes; tuberculosis is common and the alcoholism rate is the highest in the United States.

The youth of Holy Spirit journeyed to Pine Ridge to serve their needs. They assisted with house painting and repair and working with the youth. Several were profoundly impressed by the time spent at Pine Ridge, and here are some of their impressions:

"I was impacted by how poor the people of Pine Ridge were and how it was happening in the US. I'd expect this kind of stuff in Mexico and other 3rd world countries."

"Going on this mission trip helped me realize how much we take for granted... It helped open my eyes to all the poverty in our world. It was very enjoyable & I'd love to do it again."

"I'd never before seen people living in such crowded, run-down conditions. Yet they had a cheerful outlook. I was amazed that kids ran around with no supervision... & how people just trusted you."

"I was saddened and awestruck by the somber truth that the US Army massacred 300 unarmed people from the Lakota tribe at Wounded Knee... Our government needs to hear from us regarding injustice..."

The youth group certainly represented what Jesus asked of us all, to serve and love the poor. The council appreciates their service to their fellow man, and we extend our gratitude to the adults who accompanied them.

Little-Known Saint-of-the-Month

This month we are in Ireland to find out about the early Irish saint Lorcan ua Tuathail a.k.a. Laurence O'Toole.

Laurence was born about 1128 in what is now County Kildare. His father was a deposed chieftain and Laurence was taken hostage at age 10 by the usurping king to ensure his father's loyalty. He was treated well in captivity until the king began to suspect Laurence's father of treachery, whereupon he was treated cruelly and barely given enough to keep him alive. His father spent two years attempting to free his son. An agreement was eventually reached and Laurence was sent to live with the bishop of the area who placed him in the school for novices.

Laurence lived at this school for 22 years, first as novice, then as monk, and finally (at the very young age of 25) as abbot. He managed to avoid the political arguments that accompanied his early elevation to such a desired post by serving ably

and humbly, and by practicing the austerities of earlier Irish ascetics. He became known for his unbounded charity during times of famine and need.

In 1161 he was consecrated archbishop of Dublin. Dublin had been a Norse city for almost 300 years and had always had an English or Norse bishop. Laurence was the first native Irish prelate of that city. He continued to practice austerities, fasting and praying, while carrying out his duties as an archbishop with dignity and grace.

In 1170 King Henry II dispatched the Earl of Pembroke to seize lands in Ireland. Laurence's response was to assist in uniting the country against the invaders, provide for the those made destitute by the war, and to negotiate for peace when Dublin itself was threatened. Throughout the rest of his life Laurence would add the role of emissary to his accomplishments as he negotiated several times between the Irish and the English.

On his last trip to England, Henry II refused to let Laurence return back to Ireland. Laurence followed the King to Normandy where he took ill and was taken to Saint Victor's abbey at Eu. Laurence received word that King Henry had relented and would again negotiate with the Irish King Roderic. Laurence died at Eu, an exile and fugitive, but with his last mission accomplished, His remains are still in the abbey at Eu.

Laurence O'Toole is one of the few Irish saints to be formally canonized. He is a patron of both Eu and the Archdiocese of Dublin. His feast is on November 14th.
