

## Little Known Saint of the Month

This month, LKSOTM wakes up and finds itself in the late twelfth century in the middle of Europe. Looking around it spies St. Hedwig, duchess of Silesia.

Hedwig was born around 1174 at the castle of Andechs in Bavaria. She was one of eight children born to Berthold IV, Count of Andechs and Duke of Croatia and Dalmatia. She was educated at the monastery of Kitzingen, and in 1186 at the age of twelve, was married to Henry I of Silesia who in 1202 succeeded his father as Duke of Silesia - a duchy roughly in what is now southern Poland. Henry I was educated by German tutors and an energetic prince, who greatly extended the boundaries of his duchy, and with his German wife encouraged the spread of the more highly developed German civilization existing in the territories adjoining his to the west. Thus, Silesia became German in language and customs.

Hedwig took a prominent part in the administration of her husband. Her prudence, fortitude, and piety won great influence. In particular she gave her support to new monastic foundations and assisted those already in existence. Henry and Hedwig supported Cistercian, Dominican, and Franciscan monasteries in the area. It was chiefly through these monasteries that German civilization was spread in Silesia. Henry also founded the hospital at Breslau, and Hedwig tended the leper women in the hospital at Neumarkt. At the instance of Hedwig, Henry founded the convent of the Cistercian nuns at Trebnitz, the first house of religious women in Silesia.

Hedwig had seven children. After the birth of their last child, she and her husband pronounced a vow of chastity before the Bishop of Breslau. Duke Henry took the tonsure and allowed his beard to grow like the Cistercian lay brothers and became known as Henry the Bearded. From this time Hedwig spent much of her time at the Abbey of Trebnitz, where, on the death of her husband in 1238, she took up her permanent residence to devote herself to works of piety and charity.

After her husband's death, Hedwig took the grey habit of the Cistercians, but was not received into the order so that she could retain the right to spend her revenues in charities. She cared for the sick and supported the poor. During her lifetime her piety and gentleness won for her the reputation of a saint. She died at the abby in Trebnitz in October of 1243. She was interred in the church attached to the abbey, and was canonized by Clement IV, on March 26th, 1267. Her feast is celebrated On October 16th. She is honored as the patroness of Silesia.
